## International Student Fees - 2022

<b>Application Fee</b> (non-refundable, one payment at time of application)	\$1,000
<b>Bond on Account</b> (one payment with initial fees)	\$2,000
<b>Tuition Fees, Y1-6</b> (\$8,125 per term, 4 terms per year)	\$32,500
<b>Tuition Fees, Y7-8</b> (\$8,375 per term, 4 terms per year)	\$33,500
<b>TOTAL FOR A Y1-6 STUDENT:</b>	<b>\$35,500</b>
<b>TOTAL FOR A Y7-8 STUDENT:</b>	<b>\$36,040</b>

### Notes:

- Bond on Account:** Any remaining Bond on Account (above) will be repaid at the end of your child's time at Southwell School once all accounts have been settled.
- ESOL:** English as a Second Language tuition is given at the classroom teacher's discretion.
- Sundry Expenses:** These will be charged and are payable monthly. Examples: class trips, camp fee (details below), extra stationery, private music tuition (optional), school lunches (optional for day students at \$7 per day), after school care (optional for day students at \$10 per day), boarding house weekend outings (boarders) etc.

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit, you may be liable for the full costs of that treatment. #### Accident Insurance:

The Accident Compensation Corporation provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. #### Medical and Travel Insurance:

International students must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while in New Zealand to cover from when the student leaves his/her place of residence in home country to when he/she returns to place of residence in his/her home country.

Please note that all fees include GST and are quoted in New Zealand Dollars.
