From the Headmaster


A Term of Growth and Gratitude



School Caps

From around 1928 up until the mid-1980's it was compulsory for all boys to wear a cap to and from school. "We always wore our caps to and from school.

The big 'S' on the front was very identifiable."

Caps were abolished partly because of the poor quality, and partly because local lads were creating problems for boys who cycled to and from school.
