### CONNECTING THE DOTS IN OUR CHILDREN'S LEARNING

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Thank you for the wonderful feedback we have received since our last newsletter. We appreciate your curiosity and engagement as we take this exciting step. This week, we will explore what the PYP will look like in the classroom and how it will impact core subjects like reading, writing, and maths.

### **An Established and Rigorous Framework**

The IB is a globally established and highly respected organisation that has been developing its programmes for decades. The PYP provides a rigorous framework for curriculum planning and assessment, ensuring that our teaching is deliberate, well-structured, and purposeful. The focus on inquiry and critical thinking is not a replacement for content knowledge; rather, it is a proven way to deepen understanding and ensure students can apply what they learn.







### PYP: Preparing for the Real World

When we think about the future our children will inherit, we know it will be a world defined by change. The PYP is not just about what children learn, but how they learn. The programme coaches students to be adaptable and to use their skills flexibly across all subject disciplines. This approach is far more in line with the adult world they will enter, where we're rarely called upon to use just one skill. The PYP provides a scaffold for children to take greater self-responsibility and to drive their own learning in a way that will serve them long after they leave our school.

### What will be different and what will remain the same?

Our commitment to high-quality, explicit instruction remains unwavering. Our structured approach to literacy and mathematics will continue, and foundational skills in reading, writing, and maths will be taught with the same dedication and expertise you have come to expect.



## International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Programme (PYP)

The PYP provides a framework to help us connect our literacy and mathematics skills to the wider world. You will see more of our Specialist Teachers (in Science, Physical Education, Technology, Art, Drama, and Music) working collaboratively with our Homeroom Teachers. This means that a unit of inquiry about 'Sharing the Planet' might include a science lesson on ecosystems, an art project using sustainable materials, and a music lesson on creating a soundscape of a forest. The links between subjects will be stronger and more visible to your children.

You will also notice learning will continue to be organised around Big Ideas that cross the subject disciplines. For example, 'Who We Are' or 'How the World Works.' This is where the core of the PYP lies. We expect to hear children asking more questions and talking about the concepts they are exploring in every class.



### What's coming up?

Over the next few newsletters, we will be sharing more detailed information:

**Newsletter Update 3 (Term 4, Week 2):** How the PYP will be tailored to different age groups across our school, from our youngest learners to our Year 7 & 8 students.

### Newsletter Update 4 (Term 4, Week 4):

A final overview of the programme, including how it prepares students for secondary school and how it fits into the broader IB continuum.



### **Upcoming Parent Information Workshops**

A friendly reminder, we will be hosting a series of parent information evenings in Term 4. These sessions will be an opportunity to ask questions and learn more about the programme's implementation. We will also hold ongoing information sessions in 2026 for new families and provide regular updates as the programme develops over the next few years.
